Graeme would later be identified as “the human error”. Graeme authored *“The New Era of Cybersecurity Breaches: A Case Study and Lessons Learned”* about the Equifax 2017 data breach. Prior to joining Equifax in 2011, Graeme was a Principal at Ernst & Young and Global Leader of Governance, Risk & Compliance at Wipro Consulting. Over his 30 year career, he has consulted with hundreds of companies on cybersecurity and IT risk programs. Graeme started his career as an accountant and holds many security and IT risk certifications. He grew up and worked in New Zealand before moving to the United States in 1995.
